From the Finance Corner as of July 31, 2023

Churches typically experience a downturn in summer contributions as folks are away on vacation or engaging in other activities. This summer at UCF has been no different. As shown below, pledges received have fallen a bit farther behind and our expenses have exceeded our income by over \$24,000:

Total Pledged: \$73,058 Pledges Received: \$61,512 Difference: - \$11,546

Total Income: \$111,049
Total Expenses: \$135,195
Difference: -\$24,146



While we approved a deficit budget in January with an estimated \$58,000 shortfall, we still need funding to pay our bills. We are fortunate that previous generations at UCF have blessed us with investments we can use, but we still need your support to help meet pledge goals and help shrink the gap.
